UKABS hold an annual conference, for which members are entitled to a reduced fee. Recent conferences have been held at Lancaster (2006), Oxford (2007), York (2008), London (2009) and Leeds (2010). Our 2011 conference will be held at SOAS, London, on Thursday 8th September, and will include papers by Prof. Max Deeg (Cardiff) and Dr. Ulrike Roesler (Oxford), as well as a presentation on Buddhist book culture by a team of researchers at Cambridge University. In addition our conference always includes a selection of post-graduate papers and our AGM, which all members are invited to attend. Our 2012 conference will be a special workshop on early Mahāyāna, convened by Paul Harrison, with an impressive line-up of international speakers already confirmed.

Membership of UKABS costs a mere £25 per year for waged members and £15 for unwaged. We are registered with the UK Inland Revenue and so membership fees can be included in your professional expenses on your tax return.
